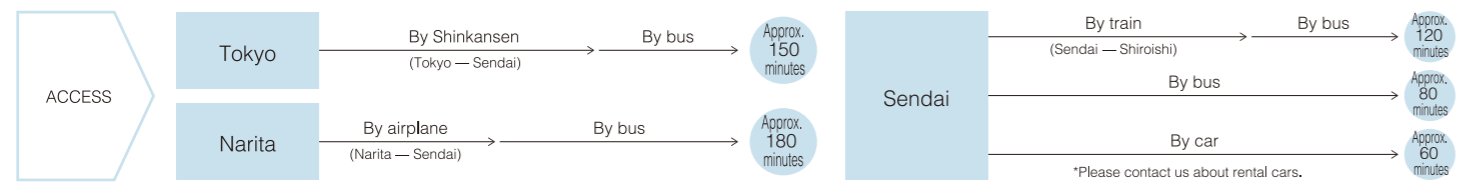


Miyagi Zao

MIYAGI-ZAO, JAPAN, SNOWSKI, EBOSHI!



An hour away by car from central Sendai, the Miyagi Zao Eboshi Resort is the largest such leisure facility in the prefecture. It is located along the northeastern ridge of Mount Eboshi in the Zao range. The highest point stands at 1,350 meters. You can get there by high-speed gondola (capacity of 6 persons) and ski lift. You can take in the Sendai plains in a single glance before you, with the snowy tree-lined Zao mountain range setting the background.

We accept major credit cards.



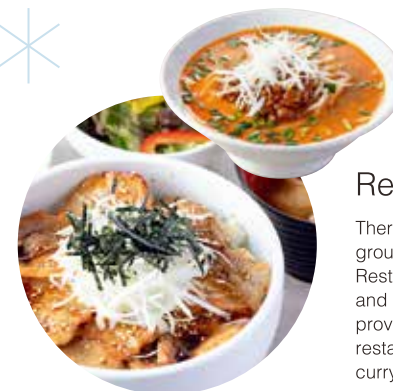
Kids' Park

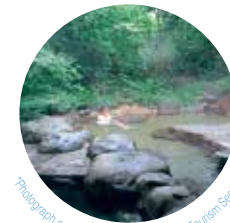
Skiing and Snowboarding School

There are two schools for skiing and one snowboarding school at the Eboshi Resort. These schools offer lessons at all levels suitable for everyone from children to senior citizens, and from beginners to experienced enthusiasts. We recommend them for people who want to improve as quickly as possible.



Restaurants

There are three restaurants on the grounds of the Eboshi Resort: Restaurant Eboshi, Kogen Rest House, and Restaurant Kamoshi. Their menus provide everything from Japanese family restaurant standards like Japanese-style curry with rice dishes and ramen to special items unique to each restaurant.

There are 10 courses in all, of various types. They include the "dynamics course" that is the longest (4.3 km) in Miyagi Prefecture but gentle enough that even beginners can casually travel its length; the "Ishiko slope," whose snow conditions remain excellent regardless of the season; the moguls that for the average skier are quite difficult; and the "challenge course" with the 35° slopes that make traveling down the powder snows of Zao enjoyable.
